The first letter indicates neighborhood context

S = suburban G = general urban U = urban E = urban edge

C = urban center

The second letter indicates the dominant building form and character

SU = single unit MU = multi unit

TU = two unit RO = residential office
TH = townhome RX = residential mixed use
RH = row home CC = commercial corridor

MS = main street MX = mixed use

The third letter or number indicates building or lot size

Minimum Lot Size **Building Height** A = 30002 = 2 stories B = 45002.5 = 2.5 storiesC = 55003 = 3 stories D = 60005 = 5 stories E = 70008 = 8 stories F = 850012 = 12 stories G = 900016 = 16 stories H = 1000020 = 20 stories

I = 12000

An extra number or letter at the end indicates a special purpose or regulation. This is where you would find zoning for an ADU.

EXAMPLES

U-SU-A This is an urban area allowing for a single unit with a minimum lot size of 3000sf.

G-MU-3 This is a general neighborhood zoned for multifamily units up to 3 stories

C-MX-5 This is an urban center allowing commercial and residential building up to 5 stories
